


Start of the New School Year 2018 - 2019

This took 2 full days the next day, after putting each child's requirements together we had a meeting where we distributed all the supplies to each child. The Mayor of Ormoc organized to have a reporter there to interview us as we gave out the school supplies. The reporter was very impressed with how Destiny Inc. being so organized in the giving out of the school supplies.

This process was repeated in Maasin, Tacloban and Minglanilla cities with children in each city.

What a powerful statement from a young woman who was full of confidence as she approached us. We recognized her even before she spoke. You might ask what's the big deal, well for us it was a big deal as the young lady gave the impression that she knew who she was and where she was going. Dafni had not always been this way. You see Dafni was sponsored by Destiny a few years before but fell out of the programme because she became pregnant at a very young age, and she ran away from home with her boy-friend as she was shun from those who should have been supporting her. Dafni is a young mother with 2 children now. Her mother is now working overseas and her father is working away from Ormoc. Dafni has been reconciled to her family and is now back living at home with her 2 younger brothers, running the family home with her brothers and her 2 beautiful children.

She had put her self back through school to complete her education. Rachel's Story

Good day everyone! This is my testimony about God's goodness in my life. I just want to share my life before meeting Destiny and how it is now. My father was a drug addict and my mother worked as a sugarcane worker and my father don't have a job. My mother must double her work to send us to school. We had a difficult life and there comes a time that my father got an accident he was fallen from the coconut tree, and he got paralyse and couldn't walk after that. My mother had to do everything for us her children and for my father's medicine, until my mother's wage wasn't enough for our needs and for the hospital bills. My sister was forced to stop in her studies to help my mother. My mother cries because of our

very difficult situation and I also cry because there was no rice left for us to cook. When my mother and sister got home from working all day I can see how tired they were, and my mother will go to our neighbour and asked them if they can lend us some rice. My father cries because he can't do anything to help us. Me and my younger brother will be left at home to take care of my father. I feel pity for my father especially when we already have classes because he will be left alone at home and we will leave him with food. Our studies got affected and our performance in school, before I was an honour student but this time I got failing grades. I always pray that it's ok if I will not get an award in school, but the important thing is that I can take good care of my father. When I was in grade six I am a badminton player. I win my first competition in school and even my parents can't witness my every game I'm still happy because they are proud of me. Until in high school I am still a badminton player and in my every game I got my strength from my father. Until one day that we were in a very difficult situation and my father decided to sell illegal drugs. We always tell him to stop but his response was he had nothing to help our needs, he can't get a job because he can't walk and all he can do was to sell illegal drugs to help us. I can see people in our house and they will close the doors and the windows. Until one day my father called me and told me to help in packing the illegal drugs and even in harvesting the marijuana. That time we had more money, but I wonder because still it wasn't enough for our needs. I witnessed one moment that there were police conducting raid and my neighbours were caught, I cried and was very afraid for my father but despite of what had happened we didn't stop selling illegal drugs. Even if I'm in school there were men that will asked me if I had brought some illegal drugs because they will buy. I don't want my classmates to know that I'm selling illegal drugs and I cried a lot because of all that I've done. And my father as also taking drugs even if he was paralysed. And again, the police conducted a raid in our place and one of my neighbour was caught and I'm so thankful because of that my father stop selling. We got rid all the marijuana plants and some were stolen by other people when they knew that we were not selling anymore. I am thankful because maybe this was the answer of my prayers. Days passed, and my father got insane, he will shout and then laugh, and he was also got blind. He can't even recognize my mother and my sister. And the only name that he can say was my name and when he heard my voice my father cries. In school I have a training because we have an incoming game, I went to city with my friend to buy diapers for my father, when we are about to cross the road my sister called and told me that my father died, I stop for a moment not even thinking that I am still in the middle of the road, then I ran fast way home. When I got home I saw my father not breathing and not moving, he was dead. My studies were affected by what had happened I don't even attend to my classes and I am always in internet cafe. Months passed when I start attending church and people advised me to never stop serving the Lord despite of the problems and bad things that happened. And now I am active in church activities and this time I bring myself closer to God. I never imagined that this time will come that I will become a musician in church and it is a great privilege to use my talent in glorifying God. I always pray for my family. Now I will never be afraid to face whatever challenges and trials that may come because I know that God is with me and He won't give me problems that I can't handle and overcome. My mother and sister are now Christian, now attending services in Destiny church and I know that this is the result of serving the Living God that he would change lives. And God never fails to answer my prayers. I have just graduated year 10 and would like to thank the Sponsors for giving me and my siblings the gift of education.
